



July MUSIC NOTES

Over the next few months, I will share information about some of the beloved hymns that have proven favorites for many members. This month's focus is on "Great is Thy Faithfulness" (UMH #140).

The text was originally written in 1923 by a Methodist minister, Thomas Chisholm, born in 1866 in Kentucky, who struggled with health issues most of his life and realized how God's faithfulness had always given him courage and strength. Lamentations 3:22-23 provided the scripture text for the refrain: "It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is Thy faithfulness.

The music for the hymn was composed by William M. Ryan, a professor at Moody Bible Institute who was a friend of Chisholm. It later became the official theme song of that institution. Beginning in 1945 it gained worldwide recognition when it was frequently sung by George Beverly Shea at the Billy Graham evangelistic crusades.

Throughout his lifetime Chisholm wrote more than 1,200 poems of which over 800 were set to music. He died in 1960 at the age of 94.

A survey conducted in 2000 revealed that this hymn remains one of the favorites among United Methodists and is included in several different denominational hymnals as well.

"Strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow, blessings all mine, with ten thousand beside!" are words that bring us courage to face what each day enfolds.
