



From the Pastor's Desk...

Merry Christmas, my beloved brothers and sisters in Christ!

Or in the words of the Orthodox greeting, "Christ is born!" and the proper response would be "Glorify Him!" This greeting is used to celebrate the Nativity season, which is from Christmas until the end of the twelve days of Christmas.

So, on December 24^{th,} we enter the season of Christmas. So, we celebrate the incarnate Word, God becoming flesh to live among us in the person of Jesus Christ, then and now. We celebrate the Nativity of Our Lord with great fervor. If you like Christmas songs, the Christmas season is the time, in the words of John Wesley, to "Sing lustily with good courage."

One of my favorite Christmas hymns is hymn number 246, "Joy to the World." We sing this hymn during the Christmas season because we believe God sent Jesus to bring joy into the world. It is a fact that people are generally more generous during Christmas because the season encourages reflection, compassion, and especially gratitude. So, when we experience the joy of Jesus in our lives, we give cheerfully and joyfully to God.

Isaac Watts composed his hymn "Joy to the World" on Psalm 98:4-9:

Shout triumphantly to the Lord, all the earth!

Be happy!

Rejoice out loud!

Sing your praises!

Sing your praises to the Lord with the lyre—

With the lyre and the sound of music.

With trumpets and a horn blast,

shout triumphantly before the Lord, the king!

The psalmist invites the followers of God to "shout triumphantly" and "rejoice out loud" to thank God for the living presence of God in our world. Isaac Watts affirms that because God sent Jesus into the world, we sing joyously: Joy to the World, the Lord is come! Let earth receive her King; Let every heart prepare him room, and heaven and nature sing.

When we open ourselves to receiving God's unconditional love that comes to us in Jesus Christ, then our hearts are filled to overflowing with love and joy, so that we give back to God out of the overflow. So, we give to God joyfully and cheerfully out of the overflow of the blessings in our lives.

Friends, my Christmas prayer for us is that we find ways to pour ourselves out in loving service to God and to others. And in return, we are filled to overflowing with love, joy, and enthusiasm for living lives that glorify Christ by responding to God's undeserved gift of grace with our time, talents, and our treasures with a joyful heart. And that our lives, not only during the Christmas season, be characterized by joy and generosity.

As always, serving as your pastor is a joy, and I am so incredibly grateful for the gift of growing in God's grace with you, and that we are a church that gives joy to the world.

May the abundant Christmas blessings of the Lord be with you always.











Organ update/Clavinova purchase 11/20/25

As most of you know, the organ's blower burned out causing the organ to suffer significant damage due to overheating. A special committee of representatives from our standing committees, plus some choir members, Carol Lockhart, and Reverend Michelle held a special meeting to discuss the organ situation. Also in attendance was Loree Noel, whose brother gifted the organ. J. Granger Pipe Organs did an evaluation and estimated that the cost of replacing the blower would be in excess of \$10,000. This estimate did not cover any other repairs beyond replacing the blower. The committee decided unanimously that putting tens of thousands of dollars into an organ built in 1908 was not financially sound.

Acting upon the recommendation from the organ committee the Leadership Team approved the purchase of a new digital piano/clavinova. Upon researching the options, we elected to purchase the model suggested for churches by Yamaha and Herter Music in Bay City. The retail price of the clavinova at Herter's is \$5,399. The sale price until January 6, 2026 for churches is \$4,200. We thought it was important to take advantage of the sale price and also important to have the new instrument in time for Advent and the Christmas season. Therefore we placed the order.

We have donations that will cover a little more than half of the price. You can help fill our sanctuary with wonderful music by making a contribution to the clavinova fund. Any donation, however small, would be a blessing and will take a little pressure off an already strained yearly budget. If you need any clarification, explanation or answer to a question about the old organ or the new clavinova feel free to talk to me, Rev. Michelle, or any member of the Leadership Team.

DECEMBER MUSIC NOTES

ADVENT MUSIC NOTES ~ 'O COME, O COME, EMANNUEL' (UMH #211)

The Advent season is an essential part of preparing our hearts and minds for the true meaning of Christmas. In a world often consumed by the busyness and materialism of the holidays, Advent calls us to pause, reflect, and remember the hope, peace, joy, and love that Christ brings.

Perhaps the most familiar Advent hymn, "O Come, O Come, Emannuel", has an ancient and somewhat obscure origin spanning from the 5th to 15th century. It was originally written in Latin. The English translation flowed from the pen of an Anglican priest and scholar, John Mason Neale, who also originated the words for "Good King Wencelas". The 'O Antiphons' that serve as the core of the hymn date back to the 5th century and remind us of the breadth of our Savior's being: Emmanuel, Wisdom, Adonai (great Lord), Root of Jesse, Key of David, Dayspring, Desire of nations.

The melody we use today originated in France during the 15th century and was paired with added text by Thomas Helmore in 1854. The declarative verses of longing and hoping each end with the joyous refrain "Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee..." that highlight our anticipation and growing excitement for Jesus' second coming.

As you sing this hymn, you join generations of believers who awaited Christ's coming. The word "Advent" means "coming" and this hymn expresses the hope of Christ's arrival on multiple levels. It's not just a song for the Advent season – it is a prayer that resonates with the Christian journey. Let your heart 'rejoice' as you sing this timeless hymn, anticipating His return and celebrating the fulfillment of God's promises!

Blessings as you prepare your hearts for the celebration of the miracle at Bethlehem looking forward to sharing the "Joyous News" throughout the New Year!

May the Hope of Advent and the Joy of Christmas abound in your hearts and homes!
